

## WELCOME TO THE THIRD EDITION OF WICKHAM MARKET PARISH NEWS

### These are published every other month and so that means we are already half way through the year 2023!

We have just started a new fiscal year and so we are in a new phase as a Parish Council, with a new Chair: me! I'm excited to try and keep our Parish Council moving forward, positive and communicating both with the parish and the other councillors much better: which has been an ongoing mission of mine for some time now already. One of my new tasks is to recruit new councillors to our council, and I would absolutely love to do that; we really need enthusiastic, motivated, willing volunteers to help us be the glue of the community.

### Become a community hero here in Wickham Market!

These are some words from Suffolk Association of Local Councils (SALC) about the role of a local councillor.

#### **BECOMING A LOCAL COUNCILLOR**

As a local councillor you can become a voice for your community and make real change. Local councillors are the champions of their community who invest time in local projects and issues to the benefit of residents and the neighbourhood.

Local councillor responsibilities fall into three main categories:

- Decision-making
- Monitoring
- Getting involved locally

In 2021 a survey undertaken by the National Association of Local Councils showed that 38% of councillors are women. It is important this continues to increase, enabling fair and equal representation across our communities.

We have four vacancies on our Parish Council in Wickham Market. We currently have two women councillors and, so, to find more women who are able and willing would be absolutely amazing.

Could you help? We really want to make our parish council diverse so it better represents our parishioners. Our full council meetings are bi-monthly.

We know it must seem daunting to some, but the joy of doing good in our village is really motivating. We also have a climate change working group now, and, as of the last full council meeting, a group to work with other local parish councils to look at our rivers and how dirty they are. We are very welcoming and would help you settle into the council through training, and help with understanding of how local council works.

We really hope you feel empowered to come and join us, so we can see what we can do as a great team of volunteers for the people of Wickham Market.


### WHAT DO WE DO FOR YOU?



Wickham Market Parish Councillors are all volunteers. They are supported by several volunteer groups in the Parish together with a full time Parish Clerk, a part time Deputy Clerk, a part time Cemetery Clerk and a Maintenance Operative. Here are just a few of the things that your Parish Council do.



We own the Village Hall (above) which is managed on behalf of the council by the volunteer Village Hall Management Committee.



The council manage several green areas which we either own or lease. These include the Church Pightle Green, the Youth Football pitches at Simon's Cross and two allotment gardens, one at Simon's Cross and one at the Glebe. There are over 120 plots of varying sizes, which we manage in conjunction with the volunteer Allotment Association.



In the centre of our village is The Hill. While this land is owned by East Suffolk, we manage the decorations, flags and lights together with the electricity supply. We use this area

under license to run our twice weekly markets and our very popular biannual markets in August and December. We also own the bus shelter and the notice boards which we keep up to date with village information.

Here is our peaceful Cemetery which we own and manage in conjunction with our volunteer Cemetery Group.

The footpaths that join our village together are the responsibility of East Suffolk, but we manage the most used ones by keeping hedging and grass under control and litter picking.



### The Parish Council committees and working groups

comment on planning applications, manage communications with EDF Sizewell C, prepare the Climate Action Strategy and the Neighbourhood Plan.

We support organisations who provide services in the area with grants or funding through East Suffolk Council including: Citizens Advice, Disability Advice Service, Suffolk Accident Rescue Service together with Wickham Market organisations including the Community Choir, Community Allotment, Bowls Club and the Archive Centre.

We are always looking for enthusiastic people to join our team, bringing your own skills and knowledge to support our community. Anyone can be a volunteer. If you are a UK or EU citizen, have lived here for a year and meet regulatory criteria, you could become a councillor. We have vacancies at the moment and your Parish Council can only be as effective, relevant and vibrant as the people you elect to run it.

- Can you offer some of your time for any of our activities?
- Do you know someone that you could nominate for election?

### SPOTLIGHT

### On Alison Calvesbert-Rearden

Here we shine the spotlight on yet another fabulous neighbour, and tell you all about how they become superstars, and what inspires them to do all they do.

Thank you so much for agreeing to take part in this month's newsletter spotlight section, Alison. We thought you would be perfect as you do so much for this community, and I bet we don't even know half of it! Please can you introduce yourself to those of us who don't know you so well?



Hi I'm Alison Calvesbert-Rearden. I was a working artist and teacher before I married, and I didn't want to lose my name so added Rearden to my Calvesbert. It's so long it doesn't fit on my bank card, but it puts the telesales people off as they can't get beyond saying my name! I have been living in Wickham Market for ten years now. Previously my childhood home was Bawdsey.

Can you please tell us about the Wickham Market Parent and Teacher Association that you're a member of, and what your aims and priorities as an association are now?

The lovely Gemma Potter and Amanda Allen are joint chairpeople of the WMPS PTA, but people tend to know my name and face through the work that I do as the secretary promoting our events. At present the main aim is to raise funds for the replacement of the "Fort" that was at the school which unfortunately had to be taken down as it was getting old and dangerous to play on. The PTA have raised a considerable sum towards this and are in negotiations with a company to hopefully start the planning of rebuilding in Summer 2023. We are always looking for ways to increase the learning and to promote an experience of school to our student as they go through the school.

When I joined the PTA, we were asking our parents for a great deal and we hoped to firstly let the community of Wickham Market and beyond know what we are doing and to arrange events that got the parents and community, coming into the school and celebrating the Primary School and facilities we have here. With the promotion of events in school and things like the Amazon wish list the community have embraced our endeavours and been wonderful in supporting our events in all sorts of ways. From buying direct from the Amazon wish list, to donating items for the Mother's Day sale and bringing in used stamps, batteries and clothes for the clothing bank – it all helps. I wanted to let the community of Wickham Market know what was going on in the school and have them join us as much as possible and as secretary I spread the news far and wide. Tuesday is my day off and when I tend to flood social media with information; it is a busy day!

Can you please tell us about the Annual Show in Wickham and how you are involved in that, and a small detail about what to expect this year?

I joined the Wickham Market Village Show Group (please search on Facebook for our

Social Media information page) not long after moving to Wickham Market. As a child I had been part of Butley Village Show and remember every year making the journey from Bawdsey to Butley with bowls full of flowers and other created goods. I wanted my own children to have this experience. The tombola was being given up by Mary Morris who had done it successfully for years and years and I was a little nervous to fill their shoes, but it is fun and again generates funds for the refurbishment of the village hall.

As a committee we are so glad to be back for 2023 after the years off for Covid and hope to have many more people entering their creations, home grown veg, cooked items, crafted creations and photographs. Please see poster attached. Schedules can be picked up from all local outlets in Wickham Market. It really is good fun and you never know you might even win a prize!

If you could describe volunteers like ours in the community, in a sentence, what would that sentence say?

Passionate, underrated and thick-skinned wonderful individuals. I think lots of people think "I couldn't do that". But once you see the impact you are making it can be addictive! And there is ALWAYS room for more helpers!

We can all imagine that your life must be a busy place, how do you juggle all your hats, and what motivates you to find extra time to help?

Don't let my husband read this! I work four days a week in the Art Department at Northgate High School in Ipswich. I create and exhibit my own artwork and take commissions (Most recently a 6-foot owl for the St Elizabeth Hospice trail last summer). I have three wonderful children under 10 (you will have met my youngest – he's feral!). I'm secretary of the WMPS PTA, treasurer of an Art Group and Tombola organiser and Committee member of the Wickham Market Village Show and up until very recently very part time carer for my mother. Juggle is the word. Lots of notes and to do lists. The calendar in the kitchen is gospel – if it's not on there, it's not happening!

The School is what motivates me. They have supported, nurtured and enabled my children to flourish as young people and I am very lucky that they have both LOVED school. Seeing the Government's agenda first hand to squeeze our schools to the point of breaking, I thought I might be able to help. And once you do something that makes a difference, creates an experience for the young people or offers opportunities for youngsters that they would not have otherwise been able to do, through fund raising, it really can get quite addictive. I have never been a 'sit back and watch' type of person and the best way to find me is being busy.

Thank you for your time telling us about all the good that you do. We often see helpful and inspiring posts from you on the Wickham Market Community Facebook page. Do you have a helpful and inspiring paragraph to spread around the IP13 0 area for us now? Aim to put in what you might want to get out. I often despair at negativity and try always to see as many positives as possible. Our young people, our communities are worth investing in so, get involved!!
